- Olivia Galati played four years of softball at St. John the Baptist - her high school in Bay Shore, she was the pitcher and led her team to 3 New York State Championships
- She went to college and played at Hofstra University, and made it to the NCAA Tournament three times during her career there, this included the softball teams first time going to the Super Regional in 2012. In her college years she had a record of 63-12 in with a 0.19 ERA (Earned runs allowed).
- Straight after college she was picked second overall by the New York/New Jersey Comets in the National Pro Fastpitch draft. She won the NPF championship in 2014 with USSSA Pride (based in Florida)

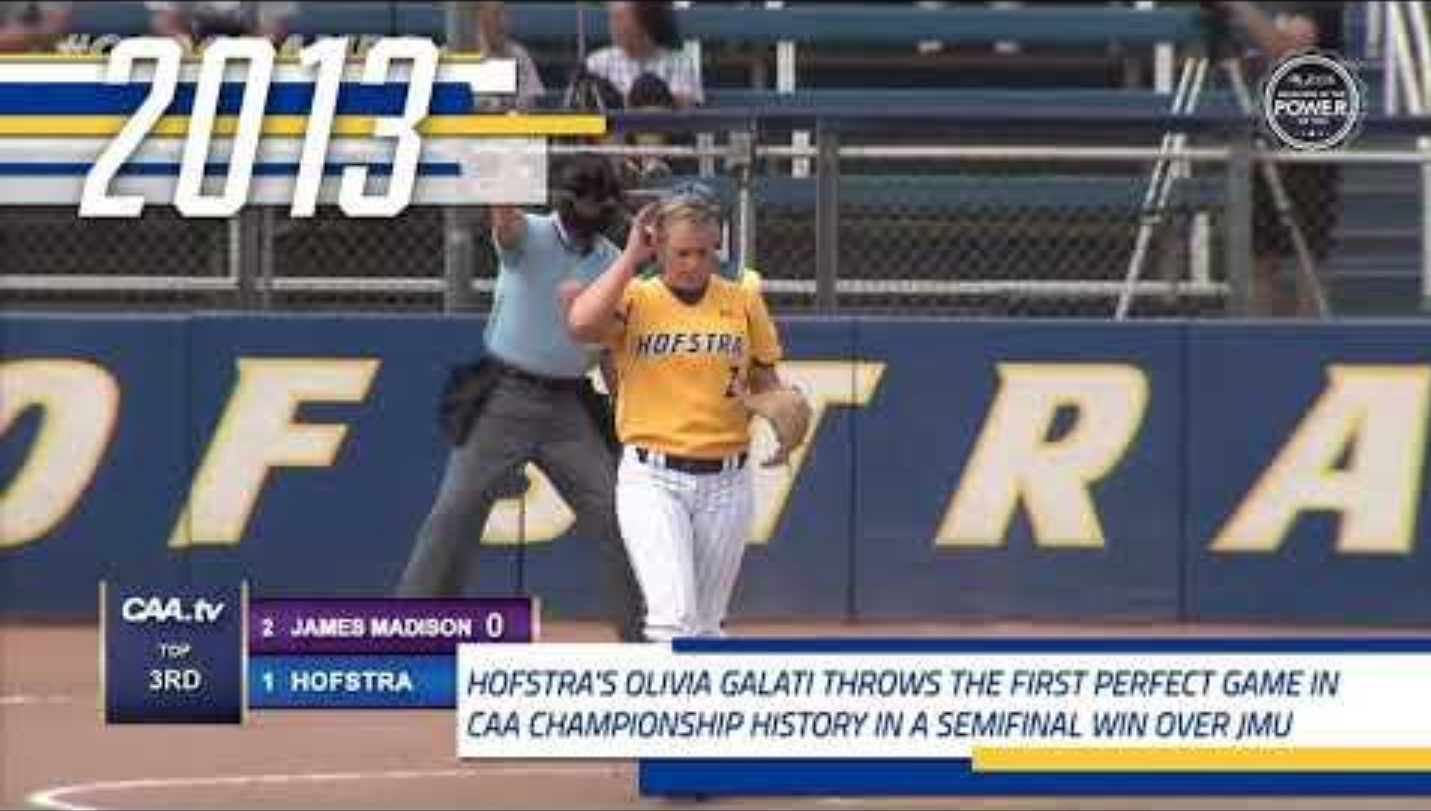
High School
